#### **Performance Evidence**

To demonstrate competency, a candidate must meet the elements and performance criteria of this unit by conducting access audits of two different playgrounds.

### **Knowledge Evidence**

To be competent in this unit, a candidate must demonstrate knowledge of:

- Commonwealth, state and territory legislation, regulations and Australian Standards relevant to playground access audits:
  - anti-discrimination and disability discrimination
  - principles of universal design
  - privacy and confidentiality
- concept of play:
  - importance of play to all children
  - links between play patterns and child developmental stages
  - · types of play: creative play, physical play and social play
- interpersonal communication strategies used to effectively relate to people from a range of social, cultural and ethnic backgrounds and with a range of physical and cognitive abilities
- methods for assessing access of playgrounds for people with disability:
  - types of measurements and calculations used to determine provisions for access
  - minimum requirements of playground spaces and special areas
  - types of play components and other installations in playgrounds
- negotiation techniques
- purpose and content of playground access audit checklists
- strategies that can be used to address areas of access non-compliance associated with playgrounds

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- types of disability and limitations that each disability places on an individual's ability to access the environment
- workplace requirements for conducting playground access audits:
  - documentation and records administration
  - format and content of:
    - client contractual arrangements
    - playground access audit reports
  - quality
  - site access arrangements
  - work health and safety (WHS) including personal protective equipment (PPE)
  - work role boundaries responsibilities, limitations and professional abilities.

#### **Assessment Conditions**

Assessors must meet the requirements for assessors contained in the Standards for Registered Training Organisations.

Assessment must be conducted in the workplace or a simulated workplace using realistic conditions, materials, activities, responsibilities, procedures, safety requirements and environmental considerations.

Candidates must have access to documentation, tools and equipment, playgrounds and technologies required to achieve the performance criteria and performance evidence.
