Performance Evidence

The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

- play or sing at least one simple musical piece according to set goals for own skill development.

In the course of the above, the candidate must:

- set up instrument or warm up voice as required
- listen and recognise simple musical elements
- seek and use feedback from others to improve own playing or singing of music.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- strategies to seek and respond to feedback and improve own skills
- work health and safety (WHS) principles required when performing
- selected instrument or voice, including:
 - instrument or voice parts, characteristics, techniques, applications, range, capabilities, care and maintenance procedures
 - basic musical elements including pitch, rhythm, volume and tone colour
 - healthy posture and performance habits that apply to own instrument or voice.

Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a workplace or simulated environment where the conditions are typical of those in a working environment in this industry.

This includes access to:

- instruments and/or equipment required to demonstrate performance evidence
- interaction with others required to demonstrate performance evidence.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
