Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- · construct soft scenery elements for at least one production
- follow safety procedures
- meet deadlines
- work collaboratively.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided for each of the above points at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements the individual must:

- describe the features of a range of materials used for soft scenery construction, the context in which they are used and the reason for using them
- describe techniques used to construct different soft scenery items and the reasons for using them
- describe typical formats for technical drawings used in set construction plans and the way in which they are used during the process of constructing soft scenery items
- explain organisational safety requirements in relation to safe manual-handling techniques and working with hazardous substances.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- materials, tools and equipment required to construct soft scenery
- a work space in which construction can take place.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
