Performance Evidence

Evidence of the following must be provided:

- · assist with stage managing performances for at least two different productions
- · assist with the set-up of stage and backstage areas for performances
- manage time effectively during live performances
- work collaboratively.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided for each of the above points at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements the individual must:

- explain the purpose of a range of documentation used for stage managing different types of productions or events
- describe communication techniques used to provide prompts and cues to performers and crew during rehearsals and performances
- explain the role of stage management personnel in the following areas:
 - audio
 - costume
 - lighting
 - production management
 - stage management
 - staging

- vision systems
- describe issues and challenges that can arise when assisting with the stage management of performances and provide examples of action that could be taken suitable to own level of responsibility.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to performance venues with facilities for cast and crew.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
