Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- confirm requirements for mixing music using documentation and discussion with relevant people
- set up a recording environment to meet production requirements
- complete a music mix, monitoring and adjusting inputs and outputs as required
- create final production master and associated files and documentation in appropriate format.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- describe the information normally found in production documentation
- explain the techniques used for mixing sound
- · list and describe commonly used sound mixing equipment
- explain the issues and challenges that typically arise when mixing sound and how to address them
- identify conventional formats for a final production master.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- sound equipment
- environments where sound is recorded

- relevant production documentation
- source material for mixing
- interaction with others.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
