Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and includes:

- identifying faults
- reporting deficiencies or abnormalities
- using cleaning agents and chemicals
- using specific maintenance tools
- visually inspecting equipment
- performing pre-operational checks
- cleaning and maintaining equipment within guidelines of responsibility
- complying with WHS/radiation hazard policy
- performing pre/post deployment checks in accordance with specific operating procedures

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- cleaning procedures of selected equipment
- composition of teams and roles and responsibilities of team members
- maintenance procedures of selected equipment
- WHS/radiation hazard policies
- parts and components of selected equipment

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations. Where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that reflect workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- acceptable means of simulation assessment
- applicable documentation, including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals
- relevant materials, tools, equipment and PPE currently used in industry.
