Assessment Requirements for DEFINT003 Edit intelligence material for security purposes

Release 1. This is the first release of this unit of competency in the DEF Defence Training Package.

Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least two separate occasions and include:

- applying safety, legislative and statutory requirements relevant to the risk assessment
- conducting protection risk assessment of source material
- editing intelligence material
- identifying hazards, assessing risks and implementing control measures
- identifying, interpreting and analysing risk assessment requirements
- maintaining security of material.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- intelligence assessments and reports
- intelligence community
- legal responsibilities
- organisational operational considerations
- relevant legislation and procedures in relation to intelligence and security requirements
- relevant work health and safety/occupational health and safety (WHS/OHS) regulations/requirements, equipment, material and personal safety requirements
- risk assessment techniques
- security of classified information
- workplace communication strategies
- workplace safety procedures.

Assessment Conditions

As a minimum, assessors must satisfy applicable regulatory requirements, which include requirements in the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

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Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations, where it is appropriate to do so; where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or other simulations
- relevant and appropriate materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment currently used in industry
- applicable documentation including operational procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals.
