Assessment Requirements for DEFPBC005 Operate a Performance Based Contract

Release 2. This is the second release of this unit of competency in the DEF Defence Training Package.

Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- applying any rewards and remedies for contractor performance
- assessing the performance of a contractor
- calculating the performance payment of a contractor
- planning and conducting Performance Based Contract (PBC) negotiations
- planning and conducting PBC tender evaluation
- preparing complex PBC documents and reports.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- government procurement processes and timeframes
- management of stakeholders and stakeholder expectations
- PBC principles and processes
- performance measure report and its requirements in the application of a PBC
- relevant legislation and organisational policies and procedures.

Assessment Conditions

As a minimum, assessors must satisfy applicable regulatory requirements, which include requirements in the Standards for Registered Training Organisations, current at the time of assessment.

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Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so; where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy

requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or other simulations
- acceptable means of simulated assessment.
- applicable documentation, including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals
- relevant and appropriate materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE) currently used in industry
