- 1.2 Identified problems/shortfalls are reported to immediate supervisor in accordance with *standard procedures*
- 1.3 *Direct fire support weapons* are deployed and the command post (where appropriate) is established and supervised in accordance with orders
- 1.4 Occupational health and safety (OH&S) requirements and recognised safety precautions are applied throughout the operation
- 2.1 Accuracy of all firing data is confirmed
- 2.2 Lay of all weapons are correct before firing
- 2.3 Appropriate firing orders are given to the direct fire support weapon operators
- 2.4 Appropriate *ammunition* is selected in accordance with orders
- 2.5 Direct fire support weapons operations are directed and controlled in accordance with orders and standard procedures
- 3.1 Operator maintenance activities are supervised
- 3.2 Reported defects are rectified within limits of authority or reported to supervisor
- 3.3 *Maintenance* activities are completed in accordance with standard procedures

#### **EVIDENCE GUIDE**

Critical aspects for assessment and evidence required to demonstrate competency in this unit Assessment must confirm the ability to effectively direct and control the direct fire support weapon crew; to supervise both sustained fire machine gun and medium direct fire support weapons; to supervise command post activities when established; and to supervise sight testing supervise non-technical inspections.

#### **Consistency in performance**

Competency should be demonstrated in a simulated operational environment over time while firing live high explosive and ball link ammunition.

#### Context of assessment

Competency should be assessed in a simulated operational environment.

#### Specific resources for assessment

Access to at least two direct fire support weapons of each type such as sustained fire machine gun and medium direct fire support weapons; competent direct fire support weapon crews; live ammunition; and a live firing range.
