Release 1	This version was released in <i>HLT Health Training Package release 1.0</i> and meets the requirements of the 2012 Standards for Training Packages. Significant changes to elements and performance criteria. New evidence requirements for assessment, including volume and environment requirements.

Performance Evidence

The candidate must show evidence of the ability to complete tasks outlined in elements and performance criteria of this unit, manage tasks and manage contingencies in the context of the job role.

There must be evidence that the candidate has:

- worked effectively across the range of health support services, in line with community needs and workplace requirements, to support at least three different clients in accessing tertiary health services by:
 - establishing and maintaining working relationships and networks with relevant tertiary health services for the benefit of clients and own organisation
 - providing accurate and relevant information and guidance to support each client's understanding of and access to tertiary health services by:
 - gathering relevant information about tertiary health services for each client's identified needs
 - providing oral and written information about the available services and processes
 - assisting clients with written documents
 - arranging and/or supporting travel and accommodation of clients accessing tertiary health services

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- interpreting and communicating costs to clients, if relevant
 - supporting discharge arrangements, including liaising between the tertiary health service and the client on each client's behalf.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate essential knowledge required to effectively do the task outlined in elements and performance criteria of this unit, manage the task and manage contingencies in the context of the identified work role.

This includes knowledge of:

- relevant tertiary health services available to Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander clients needing access to specialised care, including Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisations
- arrangements needed to assist client to access available support services, including transport, accommodation and other needs incidental to accessing tertiary health services
- communication strategies, including cross-cultural communication
- major tertiary referral centres in the relevant metropolitan or regional centre, including:
 - locations
 - functions
 - services
 - specialities
- key individuals in tertiary referral centres and their:
 - contact details
 - roles/ position
- organisation standards, policies and procedures, including discharge procedures.

Assessment Conditions

Skills must be demonstrated working:

- in a health service or centre
- individually or as a member of a multidisciplinary primary health care team
- with Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander clients and communities.

In addition, simulations and scenarios must be used where the full range of contexts and situations cannot be provided in the workplace or may occur only rarely. These are situations relating to emergency or unplanned procedures where assessment in these circumstances would be unsafe or is impractical.

Simulated assessment environments must simulate the real-life working environment where these skills and knowledge would be performed, with all the relevant equipment and resources of that working environment.

Assessors must satisfy the Standards for Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) 2015/AQTF mandatory competency requirements for assessors.

Assessment must be undertaken by a workplace assessor who has expertise in this unit of competency and who is:

an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Worker

or:

accompanied by an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander person who is a recognised member of the community with experience in primary health care.
