Performance Evidence

The candidate must show evidence of the ability to complete tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit, manage tasks and manage contingencies in the context of the job role. There must be evidence that the candidate has:

- identified at least 2 potential health risks, faults or problems associated with household plumbing design and fixtures and developed and implemented a work plan that includes strategies to deal with each issue.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate essential knowledge required to effectively complete tasks outlined in elements and performance criteria of this unit, manage tasks and manage contingencies in the context of the work role. This includes knowledge of:

- legal and organisation requirements relating to water supply work, including:
 - organisation standards, policies and procedures, including:
 - infection control
 - manual handling
 - personal protective equipment
 - immunisation requirements and/or recommendations
 - scope of own role and responsibilities
 - approvals required and process of obtaining approvals

- referral agencies and procedures
- water and sewerage plans for the community where available
- various sources of water, including:
 - bore water
 - surface water
 - spring water
 - rock catchments
 - soaks
 - dams
 - rain water tanks
- how water is accessed in the community
- household plumbing design and fixtures and the way in which water supply enters the house or building along internal plumbing and pipes to taps and appliances
- how to monitor water supply and common water supply contaminants
- signs, causes and prevention of water contamination
- common faults, risks and problems associated with household plumbing and water supply systems and how to identify them.

Assessment Conditions

Skills must have been demonstrated in the workplace or in a simulated environment that reflects workplace conditions. The following conditions must be met for this unit:

- use of suitable facilities, equipment and resources, including:
 - workplace health and safety (WHS) procedures
 - personal protective equipment
 - organisation guidelines and procedures
 - suitable work area, equipment and materials
- modelling of industry operating conditions.

Assessors must satisfy the Standards for Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) 2015/AQTF mandatory competency requirements for assessors.
