#### **Performance Evidence**

Evidence of the ability to:

- haul cable applying related work health and safety (WHS) requirements and work practices
- use cable dispensing equipment
- use specialised hand or power tools and equipment for hauling cable safely
- read and interpret drawings.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

#### **Knowledge Evidence**

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- describe the relevance of Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA) Competency Requirements for Telecommunications Cabling Provider Rules
- · describe features and operating requirements of test equipment
- list information required to operate equipment according to a test specification
- outline legislation, codes of practice and other formal agreements that impact on the work activity
- state manufacturer's recommendations for correct hauling of optical fibre cables
- · clarify safety precautions when working with laser based systems
- · discuss specific WHS requirements relating to the activity and site conditions
- explain test methods and performance requirements
- discuss typical issues and challenges that occur on site.

#### Assessment Conditions

Gather evidence to demonstrate consistent performance in conditions that are safe and replicate the workplace. Noise levels, production flow, interruptions and time variances must be typical of those experienced in the telecommunications – cabling field of work and include access to:

- sites where installation of underground cable may be conducted
- installation equipment currently used in industry
- relevant regulatory and equipment documentation that impacts on cable installation activities.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
