This unit describes the skills required to plan prepare and install metering equipment.

This unit applies to those working as a field staff with specific responsibility for ensuring that the installation of meter equipment is completed in compliance with all relevant organisational and statutory requirements.

Those undertaking this unit would work under indirect supervision while performing routine tasks, in a familiar context, and ensuring minimum damage to the environment.

Install flow control and metering devices	<p>3.1 Apply electrical safety equipment.</p> <p>3.2 Isolate water flow.</p> <p>3.3 Install meter or meter replacement.</p> <p>3.4 Restore water flow and check for leaks and meter operation.</p> <p>3.5 Remove electrical safety equipment and restore site.</p>
4. Maintain flow control and metering devices	<p>4.1 Carry out routine inspections of flow control and metering facilities in water distribution or wastewater collection systems.</p> <p>4.2 Carry out preventative maintenance and service of equipment and facilities.</p>
5. Finalise work and complete documentation	<p>5.1 Check, tag and report faulty equipment and tools.</p> <p>5.2 Store equipment, tools and materials.</p> <p>5.3 Restore work site.</p> <p>5.4 Maintain compliance reports and workplace records.</p> <p>5.5 Record and report activities.</p>
