Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- applying relevant legislation, workplace procedures and industry standards
- communicating effectively with others
- identifying hazardous or dangerous items unacceptable for removal
- interpreting and following operational instructions and prioritising work
- monitoring work activities in terms of removal/loading plan
- operating electronic communications equipment to required protocol
- providing leadership and encouragement to team members
- reading, interpret and following relevant instructions, procedures, information and signs
- reporting and/or rectifying identified problems promptly, in accordance with regulatory requirements and workplace procedures
- working collaboratively with others
- working systematically with required attention to detail without injury to self or others or damage to furniture or equipment.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- critical factors for parking vehicles
- customer service requirements including appropriate language, courtesy, behaviour and problem solving
- furniture removal procedures and codes of practice
- hazards and related hazard control measures
- items unsuitable for removal and associated reasons
- load restraint
- organisational workplace procedures

- records and signed agreements that are completed during an initial removal survey and related procedures
- relevant agreements and legislation applicable to furniture removal
- relevant state/territory road traffic authority licence and traffic regulations
- relevant vehicle parking safety requirements
- relevant work health and safety (WHS)/occupational health and safety (OHS) and environmental protection legislation and policies
- special requirements that may need to be addressed in a removal and related procedures to be applied.

Assessment Conditions

As a minimum, assessors must satisfy applicable regulatory requirements, which include requirements in the *Standards for Registered Training Organisations* current at the time of assessment.

As a minimum, assessment must satisfy applicable regulatory requirements, which include requirements in the *Standards for Registered Training Organisations* current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so; where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- a removal vehicle
- applicable documentation including workplace procedures, regulations, load restraint guide, codes of practice and operation manuals
- relevant materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment currently used in industry.
