Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- completing basic documentation
- explaining major aspects of selecting a safe and appropriate motor vehicle for learner drivers
- identifying criteria for selecting a motor vehicle
- identifying vehicle safety features and evaluating required action to minimise, control or eliminate potential hazards
- reading and interpreting instructions, procedures and information.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- active motor vehicle safety features including:
 - anti-lock braking system (ABS)
 - electronic brake assist (EBA)
 - electronic brake force distribution (EBD)
 - electronic stability control (ESC)
 - safety assist technologies (SAT)
 - seat belt pre-tensioners
 - speed alert
 - structural integrity
 - tyres
- motor vehicle hazards and risks rating
- motor vehicle standards, regulations and rules
- passive motor vehicle safety features including:
 - air conditioning
 - airbags (front/side/curtain)

- automatic transmission
- cargo barrier
- cruise control
- daytime running lights
- frontal impact protection
- head restraints
- mirrors
- over-speed warning devices
- seat belts
- seats
- steering wheel
- workplace procurement procedures.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so; where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- relevant materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE) currently used in industry
- applicable documentation including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals.

Driving a vehicle is not part of the assessment of this unit of competency.

Simulators are not suitable for final assessment of this unit of competency.
