Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- acquiring and allocating resources
- communicating and consulting effectively with team members
- dealing with contingencies
- establishing resource requirements
- maintaining document control systems
- measuring effectiveness of resource coordination
- scheduling and tracking resource use and availability
- using appropriate strategies when requesting advice, receiving feedback and working with a team.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- functions of resources, equipment and services
- organisational policies, plans and procedures for resource coordination
- quality procedures for organisational resource and service requirements
- relevant workplace procedures
- relevant document control processes and systems.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the

time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations or, where this is not available, in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- applicable documentation including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals.
