Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and includes

- adapting own competence in response to any changes in activities
- communicating effectively with others
- completing relevant documentation
- identifying and correctly using relevant equipment
- interpreting and applying relevant regulations and instructions
- modifying activities depending on workplace contingencies, situations and environments
- monitoring and anticipating operational problems, hazards and risks and taking appropriate action
- monitoring sales and payments
- monitoring work activities in terms of planned schedule
- reading and interpreting relevant work requirements, policies, procedures and other information
- reporting and/or rectifying identified problems, faults or malfunctions promptly, in accordance with regulatory requirements and workplace procedures.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and includes knowledge of

- organisational policies and procedures including those pertaining to supply chain operations compliance monitoring
- organisational quality system to enable effective analysis of the supply chain operations
- relevant Work, Health and Safety (WHS)/Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) and environmental procedures and guidelines
- relevant sections of national and state/territory legislation, regulatory requirements and codes of practice and/or guidelines as they relate to the level and type of supply chain operations
- software systems commonly used in industry to enable the operation of efficient and accurate supply chain processes.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so. Where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to

- a range of exercises, case studies or other simulations
- applicable documentation including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals
- relevant materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment currently used in industry.
