- · assessing evidence of compliance accurately

- establishing correct origin code
- establishing correct preference rule and/or code
- identifying correctly:
 - eligible/non-eligible goods for preference purposes
 - places and countries where preferential tariff rates may apply
- providing accurate advice to clients
- reading and correctly interpreting appropriate legislation
- reading and correctly interpreting current documents and tariff schedules
- reading and interpreting tariff schedules
- sequencing activity competently.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- Australia's current free trade agreements
- free trade agreements under negotiation
- function of a Certificate of Origin advice

- how to determine appropriate duty rates under preferential tariff schemes and free trade agreements
- legislative and policy requirements for determining:
 - eligibility for preferential rates
 - origin of goods
- pathway requirements
- recognition of the requirements for claiming preference or the application of a particular free trade agreement, including direct shipment, certificates of origin and other declarations
- role and importance of free trade agreements
- types of preferential tariff schemes including classes of countries and places where special rates apply.

Assessment Conditions

As a minimum, assessors must satisfy applicable regulatory requirements, which include requirements in the *Standards for Registered Training Organisations* current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so. Where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment include:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- applicable documentation including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals
- relevant materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment currently used in industry.
