Application

This unit of competency describes the skills and knowledge required to supervise feedlot operations.

The unit applies to individuals who apply specialist skills and knowledge to supervising feedlot operations. This includes applying and communicating non-routine technical solutions to predictable and unpredictable problems.

All work must be carried out to comply with workplace procedures, according to state/territory health and safety regulations, legislation and standards that apply to the workplace, and animal welfare legislation, regulations, standards and guidelines, and sustainability and biosecurity practices.

In addition to legal responsibilities, all units of competency dealing with animals in the AHC Agriculture, Horticulture and Conservation and Land Management Training Package have the requirements for animals to be handled humanely to minimise stress and discomfort.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Supervise feeding of feedlot livestock	3.1 Organise mixing of feed to suit the needs of the livestock, the identified nutritional requirements, and equipment available within the workplace 3.2 Supervise calibration of measuring equipment and calculation of feed ingredient quantities 3.3 Supervise the selection, maintenance and use of suitable personal protective equipment 3.4 Identify hazards and assess risks in the workplace, and implement control measures to manage risks according to workplace health and safety procedures 3.5 Supervise the feeding of livestock according to production program
4. Monitor performance of feedlot livestock	4.1 Monitor the health and condition of livestock and their production levels 4.2 Record and report any reaction or change in livestock from a

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	change in feed types, ingredients or schedules 4.3 Provide advice to staff on the feeding of livestock 4.4 Supervise the storage, removal and disposal of all feed wastes and debris from the production environment 4.5 Supervise the identification, documentation and dispatch of livestock for slaughter 4.6 Collate and analyse feedback from slaughter point and downstream customers 4.7 Maintain and store documentation and records according to workplace procedures

Oral communication	- Use collaborative and inclusive language and techniques including active listening, questioning and reading of verbal or non-verbal signals to convey and clarify procedural information, confirm work team understanding and compliance with specified procedures and eliciting information from staff - Respond to questions, clarify information and seek advice
Numeracy	Calculate livestock and feed quantities and costs associated with feedlot operations
