Organise transportation	4.1 Identify and engage carriers appropriate to livestock type and quantity 4.2 Identify hazards and assess risks associated with livestock handling and transport, and implement control measures to manage risks according to workplace health and safety procedures 4.3 Arrange timing and dates of transportation and delivery with transporter, vendors and agents 4.4 Assess special needs of livestock and prepare facilities to ensure timely pick-up 4.5 Undertake animal health and welfare checks on arrival according to workplace and legislative requirements 4.6 Isolate livestock where required according to workplace biosecurity procedures 4.7 Complete livestock movement records
