# **Performance Evidence**

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.

There must be evidence that the individual has on at least one occasion:

- applied communication skills relevant to the task
- · demonstrated procedures for maintaining personal equipment
- checked and prepare equipment in time for the start of work
- applied hygiene and sanitation, workplace health and safety requirements when using, cleaning and storing personal equipment, including Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).

# **Knowledge Evidence**

The individual must demonstrate a basic factual, technical and procedural knowledge of:

- maintenance techniques for personal equipment
- relevant work instructions, Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and reports
- hygiene and sanitation, workplace health and safety, workplace and regulatory requirements related to maintaining, cleaning and storing personal equipment
- manufacturer specifications for use, maintenance, cleaning and storage of personal equipment, where relevant.

### **Assessment Conditions**

All assessment must be conducted against Australian meat industry standards and regulations.

Competency must be demonstrated during the normal operations of a meat processing workplace.

Competency must be assessed using the personal equipment issued to the individual.

The following three forms of evidence must be used:

- quiz of underpinning knowledge
- workplace demonstration
- workplace referee or third-party report of performance over time

Assessors must satisfy current standards for RTOs.
