Reading skills to:	- interpret workplace and WHS procedures that support safe work practices - interpret and use operating procedures for PPE, manual handling and emergency equipment - interpret safety data sheets (SDS) - interpret labels on containers and hazardous materials.
Writing skills to:	legibly and accurately complete incident and accident reports, workplace hazards and risk assessment forms.
Oral communication skills to:	- report non-conformance in the use, storage and labelling of hazardous materials - report workplace emergencies to appropriate personnel.
