Application

This unit describes the performance outcomes required to measure, cut and attach trim materials to vehicle components.

It applies to those in an automotive manufacturing environment and involves the application of skills and knowledge at a production worker level.

Foundation Skills

Reading skills to:	- interpret work health and safety (WHS) requirements and workplace procedures - interpret machine safe operating procedures - interpret job specifications, work orders and working drawings.
Writing skills to:	- complete work sheets and job schedules - prepare work plans and inspection reports - complete machine maintenance forms - complete faulty equipment tags - complete job consumable lists.
Oral communication skills to:	- confirm work orders and job specifications with appropriate personnel - report faults with materials, tools and equipment.
Numeracy skills to:	- calculate material length, width and height - calculate measurements from working drawings - mark out materials - set trimming machine settings

	• use measuring equipment • identify common 2D and 3D trim shapes.
Initiative skills to:	• adapt to changing work conditions.
Planning and organising skills to:	• interpret and apply information on job requirements, quality and workplace procedures • plan work from work orders.
Self-management skills to:	• take responsibility for organising own work.
Problem-solving skills to:	• access, interpret and apply information on workplace procedures and instructions.
Teamwork skills to:	• solve problems particularly in teams in order to meet job outcomes.

Range of Conditions

This section specifies work environments and conditions that may affect performance. Essential operating conditions that may be present (depending on the work situation, needs of the candidate, accessibility of the item, and local industry and regional contexts) are included. Bold italicised wording, if used in the performance criteria, is detailed below.

<i>Appropriate sources</i> must include:	• customer requirements • material and product specifications.
<i>Workplace procedures</i> must include:	• procedures for recording and reporting the application of trim to vehicle components • use of tools and equipment for applying trim to vehicle components • WHS requirements for applying trim to vehicle components • workplace quality standards relevant to applying trim to vehicle components.
