Application

This unit describes the performance outcomes required to perform welding operations using gas tungsten arc welding (GTAW).

It applies to those in an automotive manufacturing environment and involves the application of skills and knowledge at a specialist level.

Foundation Skills

Skills	Description
Reading skills to:	- interpret work health and safety (WHS) requirements, workplace procedures and work instructions - interpret weld plans and weld inspection reports - interpret GTAW operating instructions - interpret welding standards

	- understand weld specifications - recognise safe operating procedures.
Writing skills to:	- complete welding plan - legibly complete work sheets and inspection reports - prepare weld repair plan - complete faulty equipment tags.
Oral communication skills to:	- inform team members of suitable welding methods - confirm GTAW and production requirements - present rectification options.
Numeracy skills to:	- identify and set GTAW machine settings - measure material from job specifications - calculate material requirements - calculate welding time.
Digital literacy skills to:	set electronic welding equipment.
Planning and organising skills to:	- prepare work area, welding equipment, materials and job specifications - manage job outcomes and production time.
Problem-solving skills to:	identify weld defects.

Range of Conditions

This section specifies work environments and conditions that may affect performance. Essential operating conditions that may be present (depending on the work situation, needs of the candidate, accessibility of the item, and local industry and regional contexts) are included. Bold italicised wording, if used in the performance criteria, is detailed below.

<i>Resources</i> must include:	- argon shielding gas - filler rods - gas nozzles - stainless steel, mild steel and aluminium materials - standard and inverter GTAW - materials and equipment for preventing distortion during welding, including braces, clamps, jigs and fixtures - tungsten electrodes - welding shields - materials and equipment for non-destructive testing of welds - workplace welding standards and WHS requirements relevant to the work being performed.
<i>Workplace procedures</i>	- operating procedures of GTAW equipment - procedures for recording and reporting GTAW processes

must include:	WHS and environmental requirements relating to GTAW procedures.
