This unit describes the performance outcomes required to prepare and apply paint to produce a quality finish on vehicle chassis and panels.

It applies to those in an automotive manufacturing environment and involves the application of skills and knowledge at a production worker level.

Prepare for painting	1.1 <i>Paints and materials</i> are identified and prepared according to <i>workplace procedures</i> 1.2 Panels are masked off to ensure surrounding areas are protected from overspray 1.3 Spraying <i>equipment</i> is selected and inspected, and faulty equipment identified, tagged and reported to appropriate personnel 1.4 Paint colours are matched according to job specifications and

2. Operate spraying equipment	2.1 Spray painting guns are checked and adjusted for spray pattern, fan width and paint flow 2.2 Spray painting booths are inspected for correct operation and adjusted if required
3. Apply paint	3.1 Primers and paint are applied to ensure interior and exterior surfaces are coated 3.2 Paint is applied according to manufacturer's recommended thickness, lustre and surface finish 3.3 Paint coatings are monitored for surface blemishes 3.4 Paint viscosity is monitored and adjusted to ensure compliance with paint manufacturer specifications
4. Inspect painted surfaces	4.1 Painted surfaces are visually inspected and faults identified 4.2 Painted surfaces with paint faults are redirected for rework and appropriate personnel are notified
5. Complete work processes	5.1 Spraying equipment is cleaned and inspected according to workplace procedures 5.2 Work areas are cleaned, and unused materials stored 5.3 Waste materials are removed and disposed of according to workplace environmental procedures 5.4 Workplace job sheets or production schedules are completed

Foundation Skills

Digital literacy skills to:	- use digital paint measuring equipment - use painting booths

Planning and organising skills to:	• prepare a work and repair plan • conduct paintwork rectification in the given time • prepare paint equipment, materials and work areas.
Problem-solving skills to:	• solve problems particularly in teams in order to meet job requirements.

Range of Conditions

This section specifies work environments and conditions that may affect performance. Essential operating conditions that may be present (depending on the work situation, needs of the candidate, accessibility of the item, and local industry and regional contexts) are included. Bold italicised wording, if used in the performance criteria, is detailed below.

<i>Paints and materials</i> must include:	• abrasive papers • clear coats: 2k and 1k • etch primers • hi-fillers • masking tapes and materials • paint: 2k and 1k • paint reducers • polishing products • solvents • surface primers.
<i>Workplace procedures</i> must include:	• procedures for recording and reporting the painting of the vehicle chassis and panels • WHS requirements for painting vehicle chassis and panels.
<i>Equipment</i> must include:	• air and hand sanding equipment • high pressure spray guns • high volume low pressure spray guns • paint and air recirculating systems • safety equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE) relevant to painting vehicle chassis and panels.
