SKILL	DESCRIPTION
Learning	- Locates and analyses a range of technical information and documents relevant to work activities - Develops strategies to research and write technical reports.
Reading	- Interprets technical information, instructions and requirements - Interprets graphical illustrations, technical information and terminology in manuals and textbooks.
Writing	- Communicates ideas and information using relevant automotive terminology - Prepares and presents textual and numerical information in technical reports.
Numeracy	- Collects and analyses quantitative data - Calculates mean, mode, median and percentages.
Oral communication	Clarifies and confirms report requirements, including target audience.

SKILL	DESCRIPTION
Organisation	- Plans own work requirements - Prioritises actions to achieve required outcomes - Ensures tasks are completed within workplace timeframes.
Technology	Uses workplace technology to access technical documents, including computerised technology.
