Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to prepare and transport equipment and a light competition vehicle. It involves preparing for the task, selecting and packing tools and equipment, fitting transportation devices, components and covers to a competition vehicle, and loading and unloading required tools, equipment and competition vehicle. The light competition vehicles are under 300 kg of unladen weight, including go-carts, motorcycles, mountain bikes or jet skis.

The unit applies to those working in the motor sport industry.

No licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

2. Load and secure light competition	2.1 Compile checklist for securing resources and vehicle
	2.2 Load vehicle, tools and equipment according to safety

	2.3 Secure vehicle, tools and equipment and check restraint mechanisms according to safety requirements and team procedures
	2.4 Store hazardous material according to safety requirements and team procedures
	2.5 Secure transporter tailgates, ramps, doors and bins as required according to safety requirements and team procedures
3. Unload vehicle, tools and equipment	3.1 Release vehicle, tools and equipment from restraints and unload according to safety requirements and team procedures
	3.2 Clean transport vehicle and prepare for subsequent use
	3.3 Check restraint mechanisms and holding points for integrity according to team procedures
	3.4 Report problems with transport vehicle to specified personnel as required and according to team procedures

Foundation Skills

SKILL	DESCRIPTION
Learning	Locates required sources of information efficiently.
Numeracy	 Uses basic mathematical operations, including addition and subtraction, to: count equipment calculate weight.
Oral communication	Reports problems with transport vehicle to team members.
Writing	Fills out equipment logs and official documentation legibly.
Teamwork	Works as part of a team to ensure materials are available as needed and time wastage is minimised.
Planning and organising	Uses available space within transporter efficiently
	Interprets loading and unloading sequence and avoids backtracking or workflow interruptions.
Problem solving	Determines methods of loading and unloading disabled or damaged vehicles.
