Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge outcomes required to remove and install large vehicle windscreens. This unit involves preparing for the task, selecting and using specialist tools and equipment, removing the damaged windscreen, cutting a replacement windscreen according to original size, applying adhesives according to manufacturer specifications, cleaning and finishing the windscreen, and completing workplace processes and documentation.

The unit applies to those who work in the automotive glazing service and repair industry. The windscreens include those of large commercial, mining and agricultural vehicles.

No licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.
