Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to repair structural damage on a vehicle, using riveting techniques. This unit involves preparing for the task, selecting and using specialist tools and equipment, repairing or replacing riveted panels, including straightening, realignment and attachment procedures, finishing repair to pre-paint condition, and completing workplace processes and documentation.

The unit applies to those working in the automotive body repair industry.

Carry out body measuring procedures	3.1 Measure repaired and riveted structural components using workplace instructions and OEM or authorised agency's approved methods and equipment 3.2 Carry out measuring activities and compare measurements with OEM or authorised agency's specifications and workplace procedures
4. Complete work processes	4.1 Conduct final inspection according to workplace procedures and confirm vehicle is ready for use 4.2 Clear work area and dispose of or recycle materials according to workplace procedures 4.3 Complete documentation according to workplace procedures

Foundation Skills

SKILL	DESCRIPTION
Learning	Locates required sources of information efficiently.
Numeracy	- Uses basic mathematical operations, including addition and subtraction, to: - calculate repair tolerances - measure accurately - Set and adjust riveting equipment.
Oral communication	- Clarifies instructions and procedures - Reports quality issues and job outcomes clearly.
Problem solving	Refers problems outside area of responsibility to required person.
Technology	- Uses specialised tools and equipment - Uses internet to research OEM procedures.
