### Application

This unit describes the performance outcomes required to prepare vehicle body surfaces and apply vinyl film wrapping materials. It involves preparing for the task, selecting and using specialist tools, selecting vinyl film materials, checking vinyl film quality, and completing workplace processes and documentation.

It applies to those working in the automotive paint refinishing repair industry.

No licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Complete work processes	<p>3.1 Final inspection is made to ensure work meets workplace expectations and vehicle is presented ready for use</p> <p>3.2 Work area is cleaned, waste and non-recyclable materials are disposed of, and recyclable material is collected and stored</p> <p>3.3 Tools and equipment are checked, reported if faulty, and stored according to workplace procedures</p> <p>3.4 Workplace documentation is processed according to workplace procedures</p>

<b><i>Safety and environmental requirements</i></b> must include:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• work health and safety (WHS) and occupational health and safety (OHS) requirements, including procedures for:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• selecting and using PPE</li> <li>• using specialist tools</li> </ul> </li> <li>• environmental requirements, including procedures for trapping, storing and disposing of waste material.</li> </ul>
