Performance Evidence

To demonstrate competency in this unit, a person must outline:

- construction job roles at three different work sites
- three different times when additional support would be needed to achieve or improve work outcomes or quality from appropriate personnel
- three examples of how to improve team performance.

In doing this, the person must meet the performance criteria for this unit.

Knowledge Evidence

To be competent in this unit, a person must demonstrate knowledge of:

- construction industry structure, occupations, job roles, work conditions, work processes and environmental issues within the construction industry
- techniques to:
 - operate effectively as an individual within a team and check own performance against requirements within the workplace
 - communicate effectively with other members of a team and with supervisors
 - improve own knowledge and acquire additional skills within the construction industry
 - provide feedback and make suggestions for improvements to workplace practices
- workplace resource use and resource efficiency in the construction industry.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must satisfy the requirements for assessors contained in the Standards for Registered Training Organisations.

Assessment of performance must be undertaken in the workplace or in a simulated workplace environment. Tasks are to be performed to the level of proficiency and within the time limits expected in a workplace.

Assessors are responsible for ensuring that the person demonstrating competency has access to:

- a work role in a construction industry team
- appropriate documents, materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE) currently used in industry
- requirements of appropriate sections of legislation and regulations
- relevant workplace policies and procedures.
