Performance Evidence

To demonstrate competency, a candidate must meet the performance criteria of this unit by:

- analysing and establishing the staffing requirements of a design team
- monitoring and measuring performance of at least two members of the building design team
- determining and meeting skill development requirements for at least two members of the building design team

for one building design project involving building of Type A construction, as defined in the National Construction Code (NCC).

Knowledge Evidence

To be competent in this unit, a candidate must demonstrate knowledge of:

- relevant local, state/territory and national legislative, industry and workplace requirements:
 - work health and safety (WHS)
 - employment and workplace legislation
- processes and procedures for human resource planning:
 - enterprise bargaining agreements
 - administration of records and databases
 - induction processes
 - position descriptions
 - leave entitlements
 - recruitment and selection
 - remuneration practices
 - rewards and recognition practices
 - termination procedures
- performance appraisal models and their application:

- formal appraisals
- informal one-on-one review discussions
- probationary reviews
- leadership models and styles:
 - types of leaders
 - delegation
- motivation and coaching:
 - theories of motivation
 - mentoring
- strategies to facilitate team development and effectiveness:
 - on or off job training and development
 - problem solving
 - communication processes.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must meet the requirements for assessors contained in the Standards for Registered Training Organisations. Competency is to be assessed in the workplace or a simulated environment that accurately reflects performance in a real workplace setting where these skills and knowledge would be performed. This includes access to:

- computer with internet access and word processing software
- relevant legislation, regulations, codes, standards and workplace policies and procedures
- relevant building design information and team details.
