Performance Evidence

To demonstrate competency, a candidate must meet the performance criteria of this unit by processing waste using plant on two separate occasions.

Knowledge Evidence

To be competent in this unit, a candidate must demonstrate knowledge of:

- legislative and procedural requirements applicable to process waste and relevant to the workplace:
 - commonwealth, state and territory legislation and regulations in the state or territory of operation including work health and safety (WHS)
 - licence requirements for workplace operations
- methods for optimal waste processing and faults which may cause hazards and affect the quality of processed waste
- non-conforming waste streams
- types and purpose of safety structures and controls on waste processing plant
- types of plant and equipment used to process waste
- pre-start, start-up, shut-down, isolation and maintenance procedures for plant used to process waste
- typical hazards encountered when processing waste using plant and equipment
- waste processing objectives and techniques
- waste types
- workplace policies and procedures for processing waste using plant:
 - documentation and reporting
 - processing equipment operation and maintenance
 - WHS:
 - hazard identification, risk assessment and control using the hierarchy of control
 - injury, dangerous occurrence and incident response and reporting

- personal protective equipment
- signalling techniques and communication processes required to maintain safety while operating plant.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must meet the requirements for assessors contained in the Standards for Registered Training Organisations.

Assessment must be conducted in the workplace or in a simulated workplace environment using realistic workplace conditions, materials, activities, responsibilities, procedures, safety requirements and environmental considerations.

Candidates must have access to workplace policies and procedures, job schedules and documentation, manufacturer instructions, waste processing plant, equipment and consumables required to achieve the performance evidence.
