Performance Evidence

To demonstrate competency, a candidate must meet the performance criteria of this unit by developing proposals for waste management services to meet the needs of two different clients.

Knowledge Evidence

To be competent in this unit, a candidate must demonstrate knowledge of:

- content, format and presentation requirements for waste management service proposals
- issues that can impact on waste management service provision and contingency measures to be factored into proposals
- legislative and procedural requirements applicable to waste management service provision and relevant to the workplace:
 - commonwealth, state and territory legislation and regulations in the state or territory of operation, including work health and safety (WHS)
 - duty of care
 - environmental protection
 - local government by-laws
 - licensing
 - privacy
- mathematical methods used to calculate labour and equipment costs when preparing proposals for waste management services
- physical properties of waste:
 - density
 - quality
 - shape
 - size
 - volume

- weight
- types of waste management services and options
- typical hazards encountered when inspecting client sites
- waste types
- workplace policies and procedures for developing waste management service proposals:
 - client service
 - documentation and reporting
 - obtaining external quotes for equipment and labour
 - financial consideration and rate schedules for waste management services
 - waste management services and workplace resources, capacities and capabilities
 - WHS:
 - hazard identification, risk assessment and control using the hierarchy of control
 - injury, dangerous occurrence and incident reporting
 - personal protective equipment.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must meet the requirements for assessors contained in the Standards for Registered Training Organisations.

Assessment must be conducted in the workplace or in a simulated workplace environment using realistic workplace conditions, materials, activities, responsibilities, procedures, safety requirements and environmental considerations.

Candidates must have access to workplace policies and procedures, workplace documentation, equipment and client sites required to achieve the performance evidence.
