## Performance Evidence

To demonstrate competency, a candidate must meet the performance criteria of this unit by:

- researching requirements and providing waste management information to meet the needs of two different stakeholder groups, with each group comprising at least three people.

## Knowledge Evidence

To be competent in this unit, a candidate must demonstrate knowledge of:

- impact of waste on the environment and relationship between waste and greenhouse emissions
- legislative and procedural requirements applicable to waste management and relevant to the workplace:
  - commonwealth, state and territory legislation and regulations, codes and standards
  - classifications of dangerous goods and hazardous substances
  - environmental protection
  - licensing requirements
  - local government by-laws
- presentation techniques and use of appropriate media and technology
- sources of waste management information
- strategies for effective interpersonal communication
- waste hierarchy and the importance of waste minimisation and resource recovery
- waste management practices, issues and trends
- waste minimisation and avoidance options
- waste types, drivers and causes
- workplace policies and procedures for presenting waste management information to stakeholders:
  - available waste management services
  - client service

- documentation and reporting
- presentation technologies and media
- review and improvement.

## **Assessment Conditions**

Assessors must meet the requirements for assessors contained in the Standards for Registered Training Organisations.

Assessment must be conducted in the workplace or in a simulated workplace environment using realistic workplace conditions, materials, activities, responsibilities, procedures, safety requirements and environmental considerations.

Candidates must have access to workplace policies and procedures, documentation, technologies, presentation media and materials and stakeholder groups required to achieve the performance evidence.
