Application

This unit involves the skills and knowledge required to train dog teams to work in a custodial environment.

It includes the skills required to develop a training plan for a dog/handler team and report and record the teams progress.

This unit applies to those working in a custodial environment, training dog/handler teams. A person undertaking this unit would usually work autonomously using support from mostly familiar resources. The role requires complex task organisation and analytical skills to train dog handler teams.

The skills and knowledge described in this unit must be applied within the legislative, regulatory and policy environment in which they are carried out. Organisational policies, procedures and guidelines must be consulted and adhered to.

Statutory/legislative requirements apply to this unit and may vary across states and territories. Users are required to check with the relevant jurisdiction for current requirements.
