Application

This unit describes the skills required to maintain the health and safety of offenders and promote a safe environment.

This unit applies to correctional services staff working with offenders in prisons, secure custodial centres and in the community. Working as part of a coordinated team is integral to the role.

The skills and knowledge described in this unit must be applied within the legislative, regulatory and policy environment in which they are carried out. Organisational policies and procedures must be consulted and adhered to, particularly those related to health and safety of offenders and interaction with offenders.

Those undertaking this unit work with moderate support. The role involves explicit tasks involving a limited number of familiar steps.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to unit at the time of publication.

Promote safety	<p>2.1 Assess risks to safety and respond, giving priority to the protection of people involved.</p> <p>2.2 Access organisational resources to maintain current knowledge and skills in relation to emergency responses.</p> <p>2.3 Assess incidents and call for extra support according to emergency procedures.</p> <p>2.4 Respond immediately to requests for support from colleagues.</p> <p>2.5 Record all incidents in the form and detail required.</p> <p>2.6 Provide information about the incident and participate in review of the incident and response.</p> <p>2.7 Ensure that the environment is maintained to prevent and remove hazards.</p> <p>2.8 Promote safe practices in all activities.</p> <p>2.9 Supervise the use of personal protective clothing and footwear by offenders for all activities requiring it.</p> <p>2.10 Ensure conduct and contact with offenders minimise intrusion on personal privacy and provocation of aggressive behaviour.</p>
