Release 1. This is the first release of this unit of competency in the CSC Correctional Services Training Package Release 4.0

Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to prepare for complex offender supervision, maintain personal safety while supervising offenders and report on high-risk offenders.

This unit applies to those working in correctional services roles supervising high-risk offenders as determined in your jurisdiction.

High-risk offenders can be defined as:

- sex offenders
- violent offenders
- offenders who have committed offences against children
- offenders with complex supervision requirements
- offenders subject to media attention and/or who are high profile
- offenders likely to cause harm to individuals and the community

A person undertaking this role may work autonomously or under supervision, accessing and evaluating support from a broad range of sources. The role is complex involving task organisation and extensive analysis.

The skills and knowledge described in this unit must be applied within the legislative, regulatory and policy environment in which they are carried out. Organisational policies and procedures must be consulted and adhered to, particularly those related to management of high-risk offenders and liaising with external organisations and the community.

ELEMENTS

Elements describe the essential outcomes.

PERFORMANCE CRITERIA

Performance criteria describe the performance needed to demonstrate achievement of the element.

1 Prepare for complex supervision

- 1.1 Gather information on the offender to determine current status and risk in accordance with organisational requirements
- 1.2 Identify key stakeholders and information sharing protocols in the supervision of a high-risk offender
- 1.3 Select and document appropriate strategies in the management of key stakeholder relationships

2 Maintain safety whilst supervising high-risk offenders

- 2.1 Identify and apply relevant procedures to the case management of the high-risk offender
- 2.2 Identify risks associated with the supervision of the high-risk offender
- 2.3 Identify and incorporate a range of preventative strategies in the management of the high-risk offender
- 2.4 Recognise potential causes of personal stress and adopt strategies to manage, reduce or eliminate
- 2.5 Regularly monitor situation to determine heightened risk and re-evaluate risk plan accordingly

3 Report on high-risk offenders

- 3.1 Prepare and submit reports/reviews on the high-risk offender to approved stakeholders
- 3.2 Complete and submit compulsory reports of the offender's behaviour/concerns in accordance with legislative or organisational requirements
- 3.3 Maintain privacy and confidentiality according to legislative and organisational requirements
- 3.4 Provide information as required to approved stakeholders
