# Assessment Requirements for CSCTRA006 Plan and monitor escorts

## Modification History

Release 1. These Assessment Requirements were released in CSC Correctional Services Training Package release 1.0 and meet the Standards for Training Packages.

## Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least two occasions and include:

- supervising escorts in both routine and non-routine circumstances
- developing escort plans
- conducting briefing and debriefing of escort team
- communicating with relevant stakeholders
- dealing with emergencies, breaches of regulations and conflict
- taking action to protect the welfare of prisoners and the public
- dealing with and reporting breakdowns and incidents.

## Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- relevant legislation, regulations, and procedures
- range of warrants, movement orders and court requirements relating to escorting prisoners
- organisational reporting requirements and information management system
- emergency procedures
- contingency planning
- relevant scheduling and planning tools.

## Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations. Where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that reflect workplace

conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- acceptable means of simulation assessment
- applicable documentation, including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals
- relevant materials, tools, equipment and PPE currently used in industry.
