Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to develop and apply specialist acting techniques to create convincing characters from a range of American, British and Australian musical theatre repertoires.

The unit applies to those who are required to sing and dance in musical theatre productions. At this level, supervision and guidance are provided during practice sessions. However, individuals are expected to work independently on experimenting with ways to convey storylines and characters by integrating vocal and movement skills typical of specific musical theatre genres.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Teamwork	• Works collaboratively on developing and improving acting techniques associated with specific musical theatre repertoire
Technology	• Uses the internet as a source of information
