Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- plan, coordinate and monitor an outside broadcast (OB) and meet production requirements, including timelines
- install and test OB equipment at OB locations
- monitor and adjust broadcast signal to achieve highest quality output
- follow enterprise protocols to communicate with other production personnel during an OB according
- dismantle and store OB equipment correctly and return OB location to original condition
- report and document OB production issues
- work collaboratively with other production staff to improve OBs.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- describe features and functionality of equipment used in enterprise-specific OB equipment, facilities and systems
- identify regulatory and industry standards relevant to OB systems
- explain equipment and processes used to test OB equipment
- identify communication and signal paths used in OB operations
- outline typical problems that arise when coordinating OBs and how to handle these
- identify work health and safety requirements as they relate to using equipment in OB facilities.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- an broadcasting environment, with suitable equipment
- information about regulatory and industry standards
- interaction with others.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
