## Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- produce multiple fundamental ceramic pieces where the materials and techniques support own ideas for work
- document a basic plan to build own skills, outlining own selected skill development options.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

## Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- describe the general features of major styles of ceramics and the work of key practitioners relevant to individual area of interest
- outline, for the elements and principles of design, the fundamental characteristics, primary interrelationships and use in fundamental ceramic work
- outline, for a range of equipment and tools used to produce ceramic work, key physical features and uses, cleaning techniques and storage requirements
- outline the general features and use of a basic range of materials and techniques used to produce fundamental ceramic work
- outline typical work space requirements for producing fundamental ceramic work including ways of organising space and equipment for efficient work operation
- outline procedures for working safely with ceramics materials, tools and equipment.

## Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- equipment, tools and materials used to produce ceramic work
- relevant information sources.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
