Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- assess and agree on mounting and display requirements with colleagues
- plan and organise construction work within required timeframes and established equipment and material supplies
- construct and assemble mountings for the display of collection material, or adapt an existing structure to accommodate the display, in a safe and sustainable manner
- finalise work processes, clean work site and dispose of or recycle waste
- complete records relating to finished work.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- explain the common equipment, methods and materials used in the construction and assembly of mountings for the display of collection material
- identify conservation issues to be considered when displaying collection material
- explain security and site requirements for displaying collection material.
- explain construction and assembly techniques for commonly used display structures
- explain safe work practices and procedures used when preparing display mounts
- outline record keeping requirements.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- equipment, tools and materials used for display of a collection
- · collection material that needs to be mounted for display
- relevant policies and procedures manuals
- sources of specialist advice.
