Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- perform tap dance exercises and routines
- perform two dances of differing tempos, rhythms and time signatures that demonstrate a mastery of basic tap techniques
- respond to constructive feedback on own performance
- use tap dance terminology correctly.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided for each of the above points at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements the individual must:

- describe the following aspects of participating in live performances:
 - lighting as it applies to dance productions
 - stage settings, production terminology and stage etiquette
 - relationship between hair, costumes and make-up in a dance performance
 - body and face make-up techniques
 - ways to organise appropriate costuming
- explain the following principles that relate to tap dance movements and techniques:
 - relationship with gravity
 - spatial awareness
 - successional movement

- use of breath
- folding
- extending
- rotating
- shifting weight
- explain how the following apply to safe dance practice and injury prevention:
 - articulation of the spine
 - engagement of the feet
 - bases of support, including feet, legs, hands, arms and torso
 - range of motion of the joints
 - differentiation of the legs and pelvis
 - healthy nutrition and diet
- describe key periods and prominent dancers in the history of tap dance.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to appropriate dance performance areas or spaces.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
