Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to culturally and technically expand Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander dance forms and techniques.

The unit applies to those who are Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people with some practical experience in traditional Indigenous Australian dance, performing as members of a group in events in the local community or in public performances for visitors to their region or community. Dancers should be able to perform traditional or cultural dances to a moderate level, either alone or as an ensemble member. Work is normally supervised, though some autonomy and judgement can be expected within established parameters.

The knowledge required to achieve competency in this unit may only be accessible to Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people and may be the cultural and intellectual property of specific communities. Organisations delivering this unit must respect community protocols and heritage. Collaboration with Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people on the delivery and assessment of this unit is recommended.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.
