Application

Planning and organising	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Prepares work space and identifies and assembles required resources with input from others using simple organisational methods Uses familiar digital tools and equipment to produce work
Initiative and enterprise	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Makes simple analytical decisions to determine potential techniques and evaluate outcomes of limited testing and exploration
Technology	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Produces work using familiar digital tools and equipment
