Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to audition and select suitable performers for screen productions. It involves preparing for auditions to be undertaken, assessing performers and selecting performers according to production requirements.

The unit applies to those who work with a high degree of autonomy on relatively large-scale screen productions that require a full cast of performers. They undertake detailed analysis of scripts to develop character profiles that are used as the basis for auditions. They apply high-level analytical skills and collaborate with directors and key production personnel in the selection of suitable performers.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Audition performers	2.1 Establish performance criteria for assessing performers at audition 2.2 Create audition environment that meets production requirements 2.3 Assist performers with performance by briefing them on required characterisation and scene context 2.4 Check performers provide required slate details for audition tapes, including auditioning role 2.5 Allow performers sufficient time and repeats to develop character and refine performance 2.6 Provide feedback to performers during and after auditions
3. Select performers	3.1 Determine different performers that meet production requirements by reviewing screen tests and notes 3.2 Consider performers' previous work and ability to take direction and interact with other performers in making selections 3.3 Arrange additional auditions or call backs as required 3.4 Select performers for required roles and notify all applicants of audition outcomes 3.5 Organise to contract selected performers in collaboration with required personnel

Foundation Skills

SKILL	DESCRIPTION
Numeracy	Estimates timeframes for scheduling and performances by performing calculations
Oral communication	- Participates in verbal exchanges of ideas and solutions, and uses clear language to clarify and present information according to requirements and audience - Conducts discussions and provides feedback to production personnel using industry standard communication practices and protocols - Conveys requirements to performers using industry standard communication practices and protocols
Reading	Establishes and reviews requirements by interpreting and analysing complex text
Writing	Inform work role by documenting detailed descriptive text

SKILL	DESCRIPTION
Planning and organising	- Facilitates an environment where performers can demonstrate skill to the best of their ability - Organises and sequences own workload and that of others involved in preparation for auditions, and manages required communication
Problem solving	Analyses and compares audition performances using established criteria and some intuitive judgements to make final choices
Self-management	Follows practices and protocols for managing auditions and outcomes within given timeframes
