The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

• produce at least two different pieces of jewellery.

In the course of the above, the candidate must:

- · utilise different materials and techniques that support own ideas for work
- document a basic plan to build own jewellery making skills, outlining own selected skill development options.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- general features of major styles of jewellery and the work of key practitioners relevant to individual area of interest
- elements and principles of design: fundamental characteristics, primary interrelationships and use in jewellery
- equipment and tools used to produce jewellery: key physical features and uses, cleaning techniques and storage requirements
- general features and use of a basic range of materials and techniques used to produce fundamental jewellery
- typical work space requirements for producing fundamental jewellery and ways of organising space and equipment for efficient work operation
- procedures for working safely with jewellery making materials, tools and equipment.

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Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a workplace or simulated environment where the conditions are typical of those in a working environment in this industry.

This includes access to:

- equipment, tools and materials used to produce jewellery
- information sources.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
