Performance Evidence

The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

 manage the installation and operation of lighting operations for at least one outdoor event according to production requirements.

In the course of the above, the candidate must:

- develop specifications for lighting systems that meet production requirements in an outdoor setting
- work collaboratively with others in planning and managing lighting operations.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- lighting equipment and accessories to achieve different lighting effects
- work health and safety issues and hazards associated with operating lighting equipment outdoors, and ways of responding to them
- legal, regulatory and environmental issues that impact on operating lighting in outdoor venues
- impact of different types of outdoor sites on electricity provision
- issues and challenges that typically arise when managing lighting operations for outdoor events and strategies to address them.

Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a workplace or simulated environment where the conditions are typical of those in a working environment in this industry.

This includes access to:

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- an outdoor venue and lighting and staging equipment suitable for outdoor use
- workplace documentation.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
