Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to apply music composition skills and create music that synchronises with sequences in screen productions.

The unit applies to those who write music for varied purposes, including to create mood, reinforce genre and historical period, and complement action sequences within tight timelines. Composers work closely with producers, directors, sound recordists and post-production personnel.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Create and orchestrate music for screen production	2.1 Organise musical elements into working versions of theme and incidental music 2.2 Orchestrate sound and themes suited to context of each sequence and confirm musical continuity through whole soundtrack 2.3 Identify suitable personnel to perform live music for soundtrack as required 2.4 Share work in progress with required personnel and seek feedback on creative and technical aspects of composition 2.5 Incorporate ideas and feedback into final composition 2.6 Collaborate with required personnel in compiling final music soundtrack

Evaluate work	3.1 Seek and discuss feedback on composition and soundtrack compilation process with required personnel 3.2 Evaluate music soundtrack in meeting production requirements and planned outcomes 3.3 Provide feedback to team members on their performance as required 3.4 Evaluate own role in operations and note areas for improvement
